A stone cut from a single piece of Natural Lapidary material, not laminated in any form. Polished on all surfaces and entirely hand worked, not machine faceted. Grinding and sanding shall be done on FLAT faced laps, wheels, or drums.

[This Year's Criteria](#)

- **Natural lapidary material:** Dendritic Opalite (available to purchase at the club)
- **Size and shape:** Kite shaped (see next page for examples)
- **Domed top, flat back and back bevel**
- **Can have flat or curved sides**

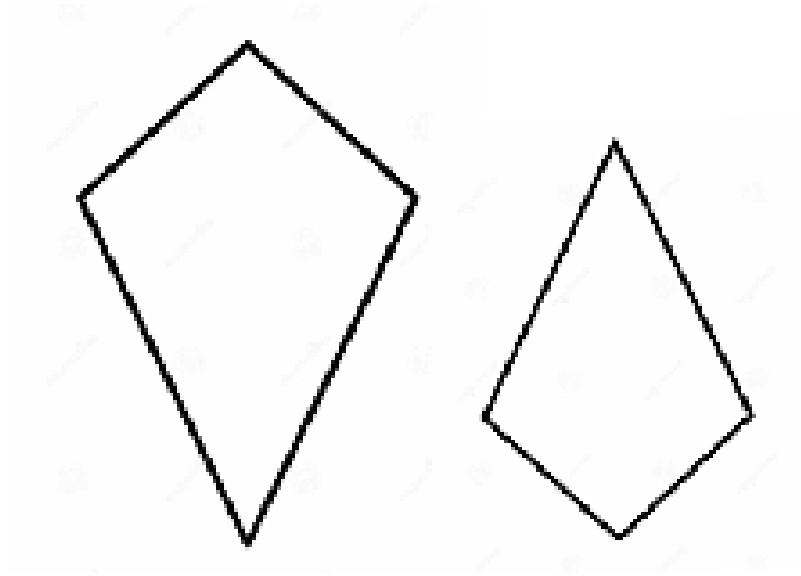
